Arwen (Yellow 2024). 6.2 lb, \$18/lb, 6.5" staple (unstretched), \$100 total (not including shipping) after 10% discount in case of fragile tips.

Arwen was named after an elf because her older sister, Elfin, was the teeny (but graceful) one of triplets. Arwen's mother was one of my very favorite ewes until I retired her last year from breeding. Arwen's fleece tested at a 32.1 micron count (quite low for a longwool breed). On the flip side, Arwen's fleece has a <u>bit</u> more VM (mostly along the back) than average for our lamb fleeces, though I would still rate the VM as "low". Arwen's fleece has a 6.5" staple and weighs 6.2 pounds skirted.




