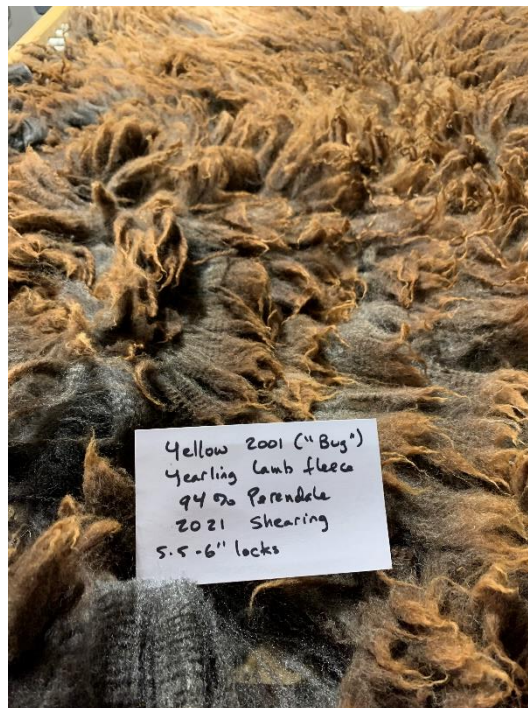


**Bug (Yellow 2001). 94% Perendale yearling ewe lamb fleece. 4.8 lb, \$20/lb, 5.5-6" staple (unstretched), \$86.40 total (not including shipping) after 10% discount in case of fragile tips.**

Bug was one of triplets born to an aging mother. All were teeny (~ 4 lb at birth, less than half the average weight of our lambs), and, sadly, Bug's smallest brother didn't make it. But Bug and her brother didn't care that they were teeny: they scampered about like bugs, and haughtily refused to even consider taking a bottle to supplement their growth. Bug's mother has now been retired from breeding and is living out her life in a fiber home. Bug's fleece tested at a 34 micron count.

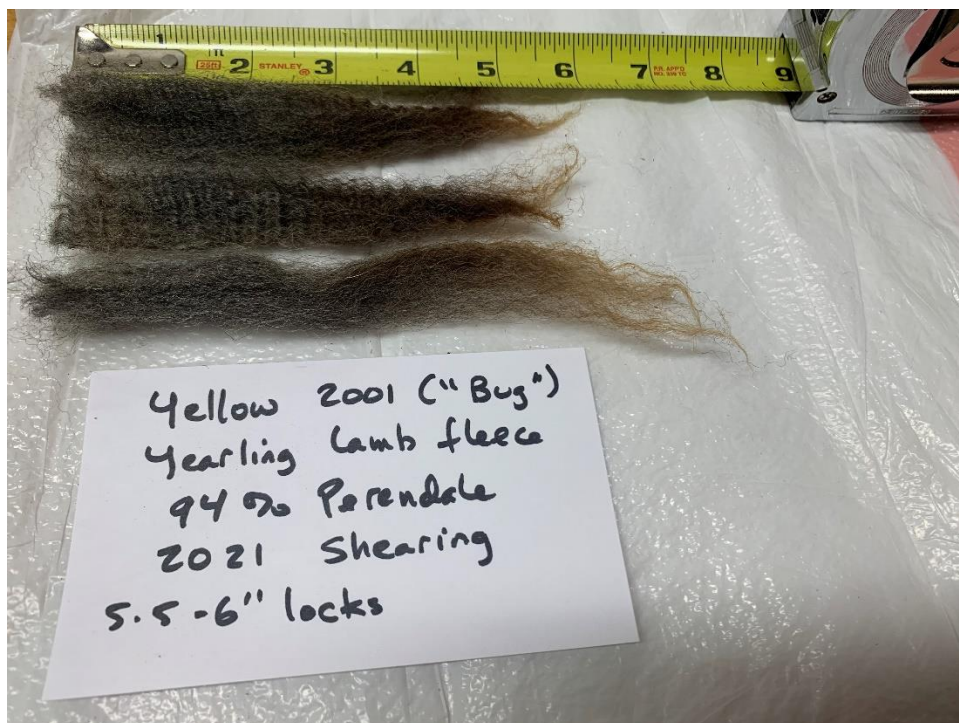

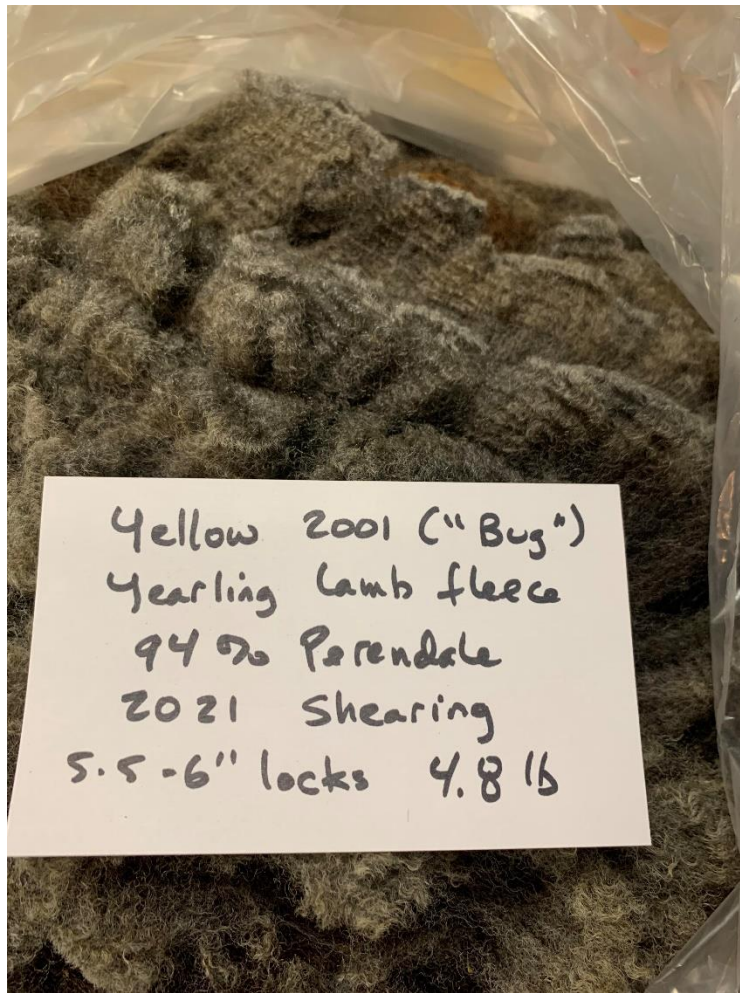
