Smudge (Yellow 2021). 94% Perendale yearling ewe lamb fleece. 5.6 lb, \$20/lb, 5.5-6" staple (unstretched), \$100.80 total (not including shipping) after 10% discount in case of fragile tips.

Smudge was the only ewe lamb born to a 6-year-old ewe I purchased from California (bred by Marta Sullivan, Currow Hill Ranch, CA). Smudge's mother definitely had an attitude, and was sold (at 8 years of age) to my shearer, where she promised to stomp any predator she came across to smidgeons. Smudge's fleece tested at a 36.1 micron count. Smudge's fleece shows more variations in color than most of the NC fleeces, being (on average) darker than Bug's fleece and lighter than Nocturne's or Sheba's.
